

RESILIENT LEARNING HEROES





ALEX SCOTT



Alex Scott was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, a type of childhood cancer just before her first birthday. After spending so much time in hospital, Alex was determined to help other children. She opened a lemonade stall just before her first birthday to raise money. By the time of her death (aged just 8), Alex had raised over \$1,000,000 dollars. Her foundation has now raised over 50 million dollars. Her empathy and determination to support others, created a charitable movement.

MALALA YOUSAFZAI



Mala Yousafzai is a fearless campaigner for the rights for girls to go to school. In her home country of Pakistan she stood up to those who opposed this. This resulted in her being shot and nearly dying. Despite this threat on her life Mala continues to campaign globally for all children's rights to education. She has addressed United Nations and won the Nobel peace Prize.

SELF AWARENESS LEARNING HEROES

Our self-aware learning heroes accept that their choices and behaviours affect others. They see personal responsibility as a welcome challenge. They often think of others. They recognise their strengths and weaknesses and try to address this. They often achieve remarkable things.

DAVID NOTT



David Nott is consultant surgeon who works in our NHS. He also devotes much of his life to promoting healthcare in disaster and war zones. Every year he devotes time to go and help others. He has set up his own foundation to organise training for doctors and nurses across the globe. the world. He undertakes this work despite the effect it has on his own safety and health.

SIR NICHOLAS WINTON



Sir Nicholas Winton was one of the unsung heroes of World War II. He orchestrated and organised the rescue of 669 children, most of them Jewish, from Czechoslovakia on the eve of the Second World War. Winton found homes for the children and arranged for their safe passage to Britain. He famously told nobody about this. The world found out about his work over 50 years later, in 1988.






POSITIVITY LEARNING HEROES



NELSON MANDELA



Nelson Mandela is one of the world's most famous leaders and humanitarians. He committed his life to equality and fighting apartheid. He was revered across the world for his compassion and belief that together people could build a brighter future.

MAHATMA GANDHI




Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, better known as Mahatma Gandhi, was born an ordinary boy with a determination to excel at what he did. Although born in poverty he completed his law degree in London and returned as an independence leader for India. He advocated self-belief and nonviolent protests. His main characteristics were resilience, knowledge, people-skills, motivational approach and leading by example. His positivity about India's future is still celebrated today, 80 years after his assassination in 1948.

EXCELLENCE LEARNING HEROES

People who achieve excellence demonstrate hard work, belief and application. They challenge the talent myth. Excellence is about application and perseverance. They like working out how they can improve. They value targets and steps to success.

SIR CLIVE WOODWARD



Sir Clive Woodward is Britain's most celebrated sports coach. He coached England to Rugby World Cup success in 2003. His beliefs are largely about securing constant improvement. Sir Clive has subsequently swapped sports and moved to the head of performance in the British Olympic Organisation. He and his team have transformed Team GB into a world sporting phenomenon. His is an internationally acclaimed expert on promoting excellence.

JESSICA ENNIS HILL



Jessica Ennis Hill is one of our great Olympians. She was the world's best heptathlete, showing excellence in 7 different events. Her commitment to improvement and hard work transformed her from an ordinary pupil in Sheffield into the global superstar that she is today. Jessica was the Olympic Heptathlete champion, World Champion and World Record Holder.

Oprah Winfrey's early life was one of extreme poverty. Despite this she has grown into one of the world's most famous stars. She is a celebrated TV host, OSCAR winning actress, author, producer and business person. Oprah's communication skills make her a formidable campaigner. She has been able to influence debates on equality, poverty and recently campaigned for fair treatment of women in the film industry under the #MeToo campaign.

EDDIE IZZARD



Eddie Izzard is well known for being a famous actor and comedian. He is also one of our most celebrated campaigners. He has used his profile to campaign for greater equality. He is also a fearless fundraiser. Campaigning for Sport Relief he ran 43 marathons in 51 days in 2010 and 27 marathons in 27 days in 2016. The latter was in South Africa in memory of Nelson Mandela. He raised over £3,000,000.

TEAMWORK LEARNING HEROES

Our teamwork heroes are brilliant at bringing out the best in other people. They are defined by their commitment to others and their success in developing teams and organisations.

CHERYL SANDBERG



Cheryl Sandberg has an unbelievable record in developing high performing teams. As a senior director in Google, Chief of staff at The American Treasury and the CEO at Facebook Cheryl has demonstrated the success of her approach. She is passionate about improving women's role in industry and business. Her *LeanIn* movement to encourage women to support each other has been adopted in over 150 countries. In 2017 after the sudden death of her husband, she started the Option B movement to develop community based support. She has sold over 4 million books.

KENNY DAGLISH



Kenny Daglish excelled as a footballer. He won 29 trophies as a player and 13 as a manager. His leadership skills and teamwork earned the nickname: 'King Kenny'. However, his commitment to the families after the Hillsborough tragedy makes him one of our celebrated teamwork heroes. He found himself as the quiet and dignified leader of city and community struggling through a period of immense grief and shock. As the families struggled for 27 years to fight for justice, Kenny remained at their side.
